

X-TREME WEEK

2017



The Frankfort Christian Academy proudly offers X-treme Week, an innovative curricular feature. Modeled after the college “January Term” concept, X-treme Week is designed to increase learning opportunities for students. These courses have been developed by a team of educators to integrate core subject areas, including math, science, language arts, and history. Most importantly, each course includes Biblical teachings and real-life Christian applications, such as service projects. Students are given classes to choose from based off this year’s student interest survey. This allows students to have unique educational opportunities that go beyond the traditional classroom setting.

Registration for X-treme Week Classes:

Registration for X-treme Week classes will be handled on a “first come, first serve basis,” unless a course is geared to a specific grade level or other preference policies are explained. All students are to choose their first/top choice and an alternate in case classes are full. Students are reminded to seriously consider each of their picks because classes will fill up and students may end up in their alternate choice. Do not choose a course that you would not willingly join! In the instance that the top and alternate choices are full, we will enable a waiting list system. All registration will take place on RenWeb (see email for instructions) following this timeline:

November 11, 2016 —Catalog is released

November 14, 2016—Registration opens at 9:00am

November 21, 2016 @ Noon – Deadline to submit top and alternate choices via RenWeb

November 29, 2016 — Notification to parents/students of enrollment into selected course by email (Payment plan to be enclosed)

December 16, 2016 — 10% deposit due as acceptance of course assignment

Notes:

- ◆ X-treme Week is not optional. Students must participate in a course.
- ◆ Once a deposit has been made, no changes may be made to a student’s X-treme Week assignment. Students enrolling in more expensive trips (Boston, Costa Rica) are considered financially obligated upon receipt of deposit. Reservations will be made quickly and cannot be changed.
- ◆ Some classes require a minimum number of students to be supported. If the minimum number of students is not met, that course may not be offered.
- ◆ Information about what course fees include and do not include are included in descriptions. No course fees include student souvenirs or incidental purchases a student makes.

Payments:

Payment for X-treme Week courses may be made in full by January 16, 2017 or monthly payments may be made on January 16, February 16, March 16, and April 14, 2017. All students must turn in a 10% deposit of the course fee by December 16, 2016. Payments may be made by cash, check, or credit card (processing fees will apply for credit card payment).

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Appalachian Missions

Spend three days and nights at the Emma Quire Mission Center in Booneville, KY. Projects will be determined by the area coordinator for the center. Outreach will be in Booneville and the surrounding county and may include simple repairs, painting, backyard Bible study, working at the local food bank, etc. Booneville is located in Owsley County, one of the poorest in the nation, just 90 minutes southeast of Lexington. On Thursday, we will travel to nearby Natural Bridge State Park for a day of hiking and relaxation and spend the night at the Hemlock Lodge, returning Friday.

Boston Trip

The group will see/visit every major attraction in the area. These will include visits in Boston, JFK home/museum, Lexington, Concord, Salem, Walden Pond, Harvard and many others. We may be able to see a Reds Sox game.

Chicago Trip

A 5 day 4 night trip to the Windy City. Accommodations will be at the Congress Plaza Hotel located in downtown Chicago, across the street from Grant's Park and within walking distance to many area attractions. We will visit a variety of sites including : The Chicago Art Institute, Navy Pier, Architectural River & Lake Skyline Boat tour, Millennium Park, Lincoln Zoo and other area attractions. Our trip will also include an evening musical/theater event.

Cost per student: \$650

Costa Rica: Taste of the Tropics

Tour Costa Rica with a full-time your guide through EF Tours. Activities include a Coffee tour; Poás Volcano; Hot springs; Lake Arenal kayaking; La Fortuna Waterfall; Local Exchange; Santa Elena Cloud Forest; Canopy tour; Aerial tram; Crocodile River tour; Manuel Antonio National Park. All of the details are covered.

Guntucky

Students participating in the Guntucky course will develop their general gun knowledge, history of firearms, as well as learn a healthy appreciation for gun safety and firearm handling. We plan to work with the NRA, Fish and Wildlife, and local gun ranges in order to help students understand the importance of conservation and hunting etiquette. Each participant will have the opportunity to safely handle and shoot a firearm under the careful supervision of adults leading the course. This course is best suited for grades 7-12.

Kentucky Outdoor Adventures

Students will participate in a local hiking and fishing trip. We will go to Georgetown College and complete the ropes challenge course. Students will spend three days in the Red River Gorge; hiking, rock climbing at Torrent Falls and canoeing the Red River. Students will spend two nights at the Natural Bridge State Park.

Cost per student: \$225

Law & Order: TFCA

Students in this course will get an overview of the criminal justice system, beginning with crime scene investigation methods, forensic science analysis, and the legal system. We will investigate mock "crimes", participate in interactive lessons and games, and visit a few fascinating local related sites. If you love to watch crime investigation shows, you can be a part of the action in this course! Note: Not for the faint of heart, difficult subject matter will be discussed in this course.

Students will learn about Kentucky history through food! We will visit historical sites like Shaker Village and Beaumont Inn in Harrodsburg learning about farm to table concepts, gardening, country ham, and corn pudding, The Old Talbots Tavern, Civil War Museum and Federal Hill in Bardstown, tour Rebecca Ruth and Old Kentucky Chocolates and make candy, eat at Claudia Sanders, go to the Brown Hotel and learn about KY hot browns, learn how to make Derby Pies and the history of Benedictine sandwiches. We will spend one day working on power point presentations about famous KY foods and cooking/baking.

Cost per student: \$120
